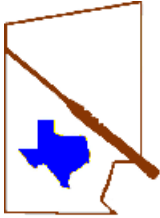
2004 has been a great year for the HCW, made a lot of Freedom Pens, gained some new members and best of all the club has advanced in its well being; we are an established and viable club.

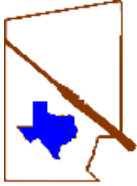
