## **BIG NEWS...DUES INCREASE EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 2007**

**LAST CHANCE AT OLD FEE!** Members, we hate to tell you this news but we must increase our dues to help defray the continuing increase in operating expenses. We have a membership of approximately 50 people and expect this number to grow in the coming year; more people--more expenses.

Our hosts John and Jenifer will be moving to a new location very soon. It is still not clear if we can continue meeting at their location. We do not believe their new building will have air conditioning or heat, so it may be a little uncomfortable for our meetings. Also, there will be a lack of storage space for all our equipment. What this means for us as a club; we may end up paying rent at a new location. This requires funds that we don't have at this time.

We have quite a collection of equipment now; audio visual equipment, lathes, grinders, library, tables, and sundry other assets. None of these are covered by insurance. We decided to self-insure our assets with a money market account in case of disaster. At present we don't even have enough money deposited there to cover the cost of our new lathe. We **must** increase the savings just in case!

In anticipation of great increases in our expenses this coming year and beyond, we the board of officers, have determined that we must increase the our club dues. Therefore, effective March 1, 2007 Hunt County Woodturners, Inc. dues will rise to **\$30.00** per year. This increase is just a small effort to increase funds but will not cover rent and/or utilities.

## This and That

---

**Wood feature of the month:** Jarrah also known as: (*Eucalyptus marginata*) and Swan River mahogany.

Jarrah is one of Australia's most used woods. The wood is very hard. The trees can live to approximately 500 years old and are primarily found in the dry Australian Savannah.

The scent of the jarrah flowers is magnificent with a wonderful scent, the tree blossoms every other year. Bees pollinate the flowers, and make honey. The usual tree growth is about 40-50 meters high and a diameter of three meters. Jarrah is termite resistant. If the wood is used while fresh it is very workable, but once the wood has seasoned it becomes too hard to use with wood-working tools. When jarrah is used for heating the wood becomes charcoal.

The wood of the jarrah tree is mostly used for timber, which is heavy and durable, and strong. The wood is used in furniture, cabinets, flooring, paneling and outdoor furniture, ship building, and building materials, such as wharves, bridges and railroad ties. The attractive grain and end grain flecks, makes the timber a popular choice as turned wood. At one time the streets of Berlin and London were paved with blocks of this wood.

The sapwood is a uniform pink to dark red. As it ages it becomes a deep brown. The heartwood is a deep dark brownish red, sometimes will have black streaks. Light exposure changes the wood color to a rich mahogany color.

Jim was in the construction business in the Dallas area. He was part-owner of a company that built schools and commercial buildings in Texas and surrounding states.

He is survived by his wife, Betty, several grown children, and several grandchildren.

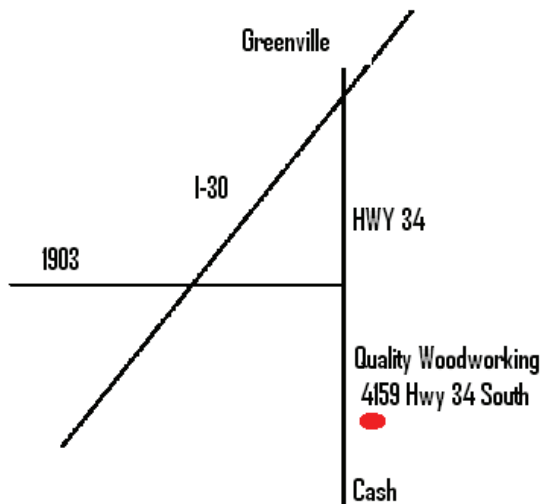
